ELDP, funded by Arcadia, is dedicated to documenting and preserving endangered languages by funding documentation projects around the world, assisting grantees in conducting field research and archiving their documentary collections, and making those collections freely available.

Each year, ELDP funds between 30 and 40 documentation projects worldwide without restrictions on the nationality of grantees or host institutions. It also conducts training workshops for grantees as well as for language communities and junior scholars in countries where endangered languages are spoken. Previous trainings have taken place in Ghana, Ethiopia, Cameroon, Russia, China, Mexico, and Indonesia.
